## Dr. Toy - Guest Speaker - General Education Curriculum

- Revising assessment of the general learning outcomes
- Outcomes for General Student Learning
- Depts. choose what, where and how to measure
- Spot check SMART plans goals met/not met
- Asked committee members to go back to their departments and organizations to look at what is currently being used
- Some areas currently do not have accompanying data, while others already had this in place
- A powerpoint is available for training purposes
- Breadth of Understanding, UN101, Reinforcing & extending core not measured
- Good groundwork has been done for the work to come
- ACCU rubrics currently used when asked why, it is because these have been developed, implemented and there is validity across institutions both like and unlike MUW reporting is done in a like fashion
- SLO almost directly aligned to these rubrics
- SLO are assessed at multiple levels from freshmen to upper levels to show a comparison of students' progress as they move forward.
- Question asked if outcomes are published Yes, this is on the Gen Ed website now have to ensure it is correct in the bulletin all deans and dept. chairs have the information

#### Dr. Hatton – ACTION assessments

- QEP "Think Outside the Books" everyone, including students, should be familiar with the QEP and in depth explanation can be found on the QEP webpage this should be infused with the culture of this campus and will be a major focus of the visit

### Dr. Hatton - Probable redefinition of work of PIE Council (future IE Council)

- The P & IE will split
- Both the calendar and conversations will be different than with IE
- Must maintain a level of readiness
- How can decisions be made without data
- IE Council will take leadership for IE standards
- Checks and balances to ensure other standards are addressed
- Asked committee members to think about what IE council should look like, and who should be involved
- Help to do quality control check of other areas
- Fix what is done with assessment process
- Reports not just written, but actually use the data, and using what is found to implement changes
- In April the following will need to be addressed
  - o Budgeting priorities
  - o ACTION assessments and how they are reported out
